Top Band Slated For Fair Nightly

Steve Schulte Orchestra Scheduled For Concerts at Central Etex Event

A free nightly attraction to the Central East Texas Fair and Live-Stock Exposition was added Saturday with the announcement that ABC-Paramount recording star Steve Schulte and his band will hold nightly concerts on the fair grounds.

Mr. Schulte, a native Texan, has appeared on the Grand Ole Opry and recorded a number of best-selling country songs.

He and his band will hold their concerts on a specially built stage constructed this week by a crew of workmen which has been putting the grounds in shape for the show, scheduled Sept. 2 through 7.

OTHER ATTRACTIONS

Paul Wood, president of the fair, said with this announcement that other attractions scheduled during the week-long show are beginning to take shape.

Jack Smith, manager of the Anderson-Tulley Plantation in Kokeba, Miss., has been signed by General Manager Slay Mayo to judge the Hereford and Angus cat-

tle show. This event will take place Sept. 4 at 9 a.m.

Mr. Smith is well known among cattlemen here and has judged both the fair and the annual Polled Hereford show held here in the past.

He is considered to be one of the top cattle judges in the nation.

Gus Carter Jr., chairman of the cattle segment of the show, said that a number of entries have been received and others are coming in a steady stream.

A second free and nightly attraction, a trained dog act, has also been signed and will appear on the stage with Steve Schulte.

Jack Painter, advance man for the Bill Hornes Shows, is in Marshall now posting publicity for the midway attraction.
